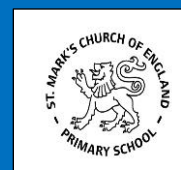

Our Context:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We are a one form entry primary school with 16-part time two years olds and a 26 place nursery. Our roll is steady and most classes are full• Over 50% of our children have been eligible for free school meals at some point during their time at Primary school. Currently 31% of the school are eligible for free school meals. These children are referred to as 'Pupil Premium'• 26% of our children are identified as having special educational needs which is significantly higher than the national average of 14%• A large proportion of our children live in overcrowded and temporary accommodation.
