Maths:

This term we will be revisiting our knowledge of the number system and place value. We will continue to solve problems involving the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will learn about fractions, time, position and direction.



English:

This term we will be reading the following two texts: The 'Tin Forest' by Helen Ward and Wayne Anderson and 'The Pied Piper of Hamelin' by Michael Morpuugo. Children will be exploring non-fiction outcomes, information reports, adverts, narratives and poetry. Children will be developing their writing, reading and grammar skills. 'The Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura linked to our Class Topic.



PSHE:

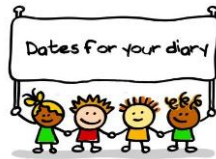


Children will learn about a range of sources and countries where food comes from. They will learn how to keep fit and active. We will explore people's choices about spending and saving money. Children will study different jobs people do to earn money. They will also learn about the roles of charities.



D&T/ Art:

Art this term will include Stone Age cave art and looking at Iron Age Celtic patterns in shields and Jewellery. We will study representations of Stone Henge in art and models. To improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay]

Topic:

Our History topic this term is Prehistoric Britain from 'Stone Age to Iron Age'. This will include Neolithic hunters and gatherers and early farmers.



Science:



In science we will be learning about Forces. How things move on different surfaces, magnetism, attraction, repulsion and comparing materials.

We will look at Light and Shadows and find patterns in the way that size of shadow changes. Learn that light is reflected from different surfaces.



Music:

Children will improvise and compose music for a range of purposes. They will appreciate and understand a wide range of music drawn from different traditions, great composers and musicians. The children will perform using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing control and expression.



Geography:

In Geography we will be exploring Iron Age settlements. We will be mapping UK monuments located in different counties and cities. We will study the settlement of Skara Brae and discover the importance of Stonehenge.



P.E:

This term in PE children will play competitive games, applying basic skills for attacking and defending. Children will continue to develop their strength, control and balance in athletics.



Religious Education:

We will be learning about Buddhism, reflecting on their beliefs and exploring stories from the Faith. Explore the question "Who is Jesus"



Spanish:

Children will learn key vocabulary and begin conversations in Spanish.

We will be learning to program using Beebots and scratch. We will continue to build our skills on using the laptops.
