RE Curriculum Update

We are continuing to follow the new Scheme of Work developed by the London Diocesan Board for Schools (LDBS) this year.

The scheme introduces a 'BIG QUESTION?' each term which forms the topic of study.

Reception - Who made the wonderful world and why?

Year 1 - What responsibility has God given people about taking care of creation?

Year 2 - Why did Jesus teach the Lord's Prayer as the way to pray?

Year 3 - What is the bible's big story?

Year 4 - How did belief in God affect the actions of people in the Old Testament?

Year 5 - What do the miracles of Jesus teach?

Year 6 - What is the journey of life and death?

Please support your child's learning by asking them questions about what they have been learning in RE and coming in to look at their RE books.

This term we will be introducing Core Christian Concepts into our RE Teaching and Learning Curriculum. Each Unit of Study considers one of the Concepts. These are:

God
Creation
The Fall
People of God
Incarnation
Gospel
Salvation
Kingdom of God



Next half term we will send out more information about how these Concepts tell the Big Story of the bible.

Each week we will be learning a new bible verse so that by the end of the term the children can say them all off by heart!

Please encourage your child by helping them to learn them at home and explaining to them what they mean.

Matthew 7 vs 7 Ask and will receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be open to you.

Ephesians 4 vs 32 Be kind and loving to one another.

Forgive each other as God forgives you through Jesus Christ.

Romans 12 vs 18 Do everything possible on your part to live in peace with everybody

Matthew 11 vs 28 Come to me all who are tired from carrying heavy loads and I will give you rest.

Matthew 13 vs 38 The field is the world and the good seed is the people who belong to the kingdom.

Have fun learning the verses - there will be a certificate for those who can learn them all - and for parents too!
