The scheme introduces a 'BIG QUESTION?' each term which forms the topic of study.

This first half term most classes will be studying another faith..followed by an Easter theme after half term..

Reception - Why is Jesus special/Why is Easter special?

Year 1 - What does it mean to be a Muslim/What are God's rules for living?

Year 2 -What are the 5 pillars of Islam/What do the Easter Symbols mean to Christians?

Year 3 -What does it mean to be a Jew?/Who is the most important person in the Easter Story?

Year 4 - What is the importance of symbolism, teaching and beliefs in Hinduism/ How does Holy Communion build a community?

Year 5 - What do Sikhs believe/ What happens in church at Easter?

Year 6 - What does it mean to be a Buddhist?/What is the hope of Easter?

Please support your child's learning by asking them questions about what they have been learning in RE and coming in to look at their RE books..

We now have a good understanding of the Core Christian Concepts and have some beautiful hall art for you to see that the children did last term..if you haven't seen it yet please do!

Creation – The universe and human life – in God's image The Fall – The separation of God and humans

People of God - Trying to find the way back to God

Incarnation – Jesus as the answer – God in flesh Gospel

Salvation – Jesus' death and resurrection – people are saved Kingdom of God – Living as God intended – empowered by His spirit







Each week we will be learning a new

bible verse so that by the end of the term the children can say them all off by heart! Please encourage your child by helping them to learn them at home and explaining to them what they mean.

Philippians 4 vs 13 - I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.

Psalm 26 vs 3 - When I am afraid I put my trust in you
