Have a go at reading the numbers and ingredients.</p> <p>https://pin.it/4JzbGs5</p> 	<p><u>Easter Bunny Shape Pictures</u></p> <p>Can you draw a bunny using 2D shapes? Try using circles, ovals, squares, rectangles and triangles. How many of each shape did you use? Which shape did you use the most/least?</p> 
<p><u>Easter Egg Creations</u></p> <p>Can you paint (or draw) your own Easter eggs? Have a go at using a repeating colour pattern, e.g. purple stripe, yellow stripe, purple stripe, yellow stripe. Make as many as you can for your Easter egg hunt (see below)!</p> 	<p><u>Playdough Chicks</u></p> <p>Have a go at making playdough with somebody at home (instructions are in the link below).</p> <p>Can you mix the ingredients together? Can you roll and squash your playdough together to make a chick? Take turns to tell each part of the story, e.g.</p> <p>Adult - "Once upon a time there was..." Child - "..." Adult - "He lived in..." Child - "..." Adult - "One day he decided to..." Child - "..."</p> 
<p><u>Easter Egg Hunt</u></p> <p>Ask someone to hide your Easter eggs (see above) around your home and garden. Set a timer on a phone and go on a hunt for your eggs!</p> <p>Can you make a tally to show how many eggs you found? How many minutes did it take for you to find all of the eggs? Did you find any eggs underneath/next to/on top of/behind/in front of any objects?</p> 	<p><u>Easter Card - Footprint Bunnies</u></p> <p>Paint the bottom of your feet (or draw around them), then press them onto paper. Let them dry and cut them out, do this twice. Stick these onto paper to make the ears and feet and create the rest of your bunny.</p> <p>On the other side of the paper write a message to somebody you love and give it to them as an Easter card.</p> 	<p><u>'In the Garden' - Summer 1 Topic</u></p> <p>Our new topic in Summer 1 will be 'In the Garden'. There will be lots of fun ideas on the home learning page to help you learn about plants and minibeasts.</p> <p>To begin our new topic, can you have a go at growing something at home? Some ideas are; apple seeds, avocado seeds, cress seeds, dried beans, mustard seeds or sunflower seeds.</p> <p>What do you think they will need to grow? Where would be a good place in your house for them to grow? Can you keep a diary of their growth?</p>
