Look carefully at their length. Which is the longest? Which is shortest? How do you know? Which dinosaur is longer/shorter than the other dinosaur? Have a go at using the key words below to describe them. Longer/shorter Length Longest/shortest	<u>Story Telling and Writing</u> Continue to work through the 'Mavis the Magical Cat' activities from the booklet to help develop your language and storytelling. When you have finished the activities, have a go at making a helicopter story and try to use some of the language from 'Mavis the Magical Cat'.

<u>Wednesday</u> 'Lance's Weekly Workout' can be found every Wednesday on the News Page.	<u>Topic/ICT</u> Ask someone at home to help you research online different types of dinosaurs. You could also watch the video below: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bENtOFR66YY</u> Can you remember the names of any of the dinosaurs? Which is your favourite dinosaur? Can you describe it? Does it have a long neck or a long tail? What colour is the dinosaur? How does it travel, can it swim or fly or walk?	<u>Maths</u> Have another look at the dinosaurs you made yesterday for Maths. Have a go at ordering the dinosaurs from the shortest to the longest. Make sure you order them fairly, using the same starting point, e.g. their tail or mouth. Use the key words from yesterday as you order them.	Family Box In Emerald Class we have our own Family Tree display. Have a go at making your own at home, on your living room or bedroom door. For the trunk and branches you could use brown tissue paper, brown wrapping paper or draw and colour in a big tree using white paper. Then have a go at making some leaves to go on your tree. Ask somebody at home to give you photos of your family to decorate the tree and remind you of your loved ones.
<u>Thursday</u>	<u>Topic/Literacy</u> Draw a picture of your favourite dinosaur. Think carefully about what your dinosaur looks like. Label or a write sentence to describe your dinosaur, e.g. 'sharp teeth' or 'a T-Rex has sharp teeth'. Try to sound out the words by yourself and use your Phase 2 and 3 sound mats to help you. Also use the tricky words if you need help. You can find these on the home learning page 'Phonics Resources'.	<u>Maths</u> Have another look at the dinosaurs you made for Tuesday's Maths. Which dinosaur was the longest? Which was the shortest? Have a go at using cubes or pieces of paper cut into squares of the same size to measure your dinosaurs. Have a go at writing the amount of cubes you used to measure the length of each dinosaur.	<u>RE</u> <u>Big Question: Who cares for this special world andwhy?</u> This Week's Question: How can we care for our school? Our school and play ground can get messy when we drop our fruit or when the leaves fall to the ground. How can we help to look after our school? Who else helps to care for our school? <u>Friday</u>	<u>Topic/DT</u> Collect empty boxes, kitchen roll tubes, bottle lids and cartons. Have a go at making your favourite dinosaur using the junk. Try to attach the objects together using tape. You could paint your dinosaurs when they are finished. Remember to add extra details, like sharp teeth or spikes. When you have finished take a picture and email it to <u>admin@st-marks.islington.sch.uk</u> and Miss Adams will share them on the blog page.	<u>Maths</u> Remind yourself of the information you found out about dinosaurs Wednesday. Print pictures of up to 10 dinosaurs or ask someone at home to help you draw them. Describe the features of the dinosaurs and try to sort them into groups, e.g. whether they have wings, tails, if they can swim, if they are herbivores, omnivores or carnivores.	<u>Freestyle Fridays</u> Play your favourite music and take it in turns with your family to dance your best moves in the middle of the room! Have you learnt any new dance moves since you started Emerald Class? Which moves are you excited to share with your friends?
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
