English Lessons

Monday: The 1960s were a huge time of change in America and marked the beginning of the Space Race between America and Russia. What ways did America change? Can you recognise any of the faces in the bus windows? Why were people protesting and singing?

Today you are going to make a non-chronological report about the American Civil Rights movement. This means that you need a main title (**What was the American Civil Rights Movement?**) and subtitles to support all of the information you find. It is important that we understand what was going on in America at this time especially for the main characters. DO NOT copy from the website, you need to rewrite the information in your own words, using a range of vocabulary that you understand.

Use these subtitles:

- What was the Civil Rights movement?
- Segregation in America
- Peaceful protests
- Key Events and People
- Civil Rights Act 1964
- Voting Rights Act 1965

Tuesday: Christine supported engineers getting planes to travel faster than the speed of sound. She also was part of the team which launched Apollo 11. Watch the clip of the Apollo 11 mission and Neil Armstrong's speech that I have linked on the page. Now you are going to write a diary entry as Neil Armstrong describing everything that happened during his 3 day trip to the moon from beginning to end, make sure you describe how he felt, what it looked like, who he was with. Remember he was the first man to ever leave earth!

Wednesday: Firstly you are going to play 'A Change In Tone' which is attached to the timetable page as a resource. It gives you informal verbs in green and formal verbs in pink, you need to pair them up. This will help you with your task.

Today we are still thinking about the Apollo 11 space mission. Yesterday you wrote a diary entry as Neil Armstrong which is an example of informal writing. Today we are going to write an official NASA report for what happened during the Apollo 11 Space Mission which was very formal. Christine

Darden was part of a team that had to write reports on all space missions. This was very formal and it had to be very factual to keep records of all of the missions. Use the article from NASA's website to help you do this. Use the verbs from the starter to sequence events and the worksheet to write your report on.

Thursday: Why do you think the book we are reading is called *Hidden Figures*?

Even though these women's achievements are being recognised now, it has been a long struggle for their story to be told, why do you think that has been the case? We are going to plan a newspaper opinion piece that reviews the importance of the book and film. These women were living in a time where white people were rewarded with recognition for their actions and black people were not. For example, Katherine Johnson was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2015 and in 2016 with the NASA Group Achievement award even though her achievements happened over 40 years prior.

Have you ever read an opinion piece? Opinion pieces are pieces of writing where the writer is able to give his/her opinion about an important and perhaps controversial question. Take a look at some here - <https://www.theguardian.com/uk/commentisfree>

The question we are discussing is - **Why should we remember the achievements of these women?**

Friday – Today you are going to use your plan to write your opinion piece. Make sure you have the title (**Why should we remember the achievements of the 'Hidden Figures' women?**) and clear use of paragraphs and enthusiastic vocabulary. You need to convince people of how important this is.

Make sure you include the following;

- Both sides of the argument
- Clearly stated opinions
- Reasons for holding that opinion
- Examples to support the reasons

- Conclusions that are restated with enthusiasm
