English Lessons

<u>Monday:</u> Today we are going to write a persuasive letter as Mary Jackson to the judge at the courthouse persuading them to allow her to attend the high level maths classes at Hampton High School. Remember that she wasn't allowed to take these classes because American schools were segregated and only white people could attend the school which was a huge injustice. Think back to when we wrote a letter as Philippe Petite to the judge who was sentencing him. You need to speak formally and ask for what you want, how you want it to happen and for what reason. You need to do all of the activities below. Read the information carefully.

We need to put on our most formal voices! We might need to use sentence openers such as the ones above. For example:

I strongly urge you to change the law and support my application. This is an injustice!

<u>Tuesday:</u> What do you think of the character of Mary Jackson? When were the times in her life when she had to prove herself? Use the 'Role on the Wall Worksheet' to write notes about how she might have been feeling at different parts of the story. Write these feeling in the inside of the character outline. Around the outside of the character outline, write how she behaved at different moments in the story so far and the things she had to do.

<u>Wednesday:</u> Why does the author repeat the phrase, 'And again'? What impression does this give us of Katherine? Why does the author also repeat the phrase throughout the book '...was good at math. *Really good'*?

<u>Thursday:</u> Make sure you watch the video I have linked which shows how Katherine felt about segregation. Katherine had three daughters and a husband but, in 1956, her husband fell ill and died. She would often work long hours and not see her children as often as she would have liked. Today you are going to write a letter from Katherine to her three daughters. What advice do you think Katherine would have given to her three daughters Katherine, Constance and Joylette? This would be an informal letter as she will speak lovingly to her children. Think about the difference between this letter and Mary's letter. I have shown an example below.

It will be important you talk to each other and comfort each other. If you feel that people have low expectations of you - either for the colour of your skin or because you are a girl - then show how innovative and versatile you can be. Be persistent like your mother!

<u>Friday</u>

In the video the women march across from their designated area to support the operation of the computer. Imagine that you were one of the women who was in the computer pool. This day would have been a huge moment in your life, why?

This was also a historic day as NASA was moving from using human computers to using electronic computers. It was therefore vital that these women became skilled at using this new kind of computer in order to maintain their jobs. You are going to write a diary entry as one of the women who joined Dorothy Vaughan that day, recording their feelings and thoughts and exactly what happened. Here is the beginning of an example:

Dear diary, what a historic day it has been! It had to be one of the most awkward and exhitarating moments in my life. I have to say, Dorothy is the most impressive and resilient woman I know.
