Monday's RE Lesson - How to make a Shofar Horn

Make a Shofar

A shofar is used to awake and inspire - it's easy to make your own!

During Rosh Hashanah a Shofar, traditionally made from a hollowed out rams horn, is blown to awaken and inspire. The Shofar is such an integral part of Rosh Hashanah that sometimes the holiday is called Yom Teruah, which translate to "day of the Shofar blast" in Hebrew. You and your child can easily make your own Shofar at home.

Supplies Needed

All you need is a large paper plate, tape, glue, construction paper, scissors markers, paint or ribbon and yarn

Steps

- 1. Roll a large paper plate into a cone shape. Fasten it with tape.
- 2. Glue construction paper around the cone shape, and trim the edges. Use markers or paint to decorate the horn, or glue on ribbon.
- 3. Slip a piece of yarn through the inside of the horn, and tie the ends to make a handle.



Friday's VE Day lesson - World War One Medal for inspiration

This medal celebrated the end of the First World War and was given to soldiers who had fought in active theatres of the war. It was a symbol of **great pride** but its design was also highly **symbolic**.
