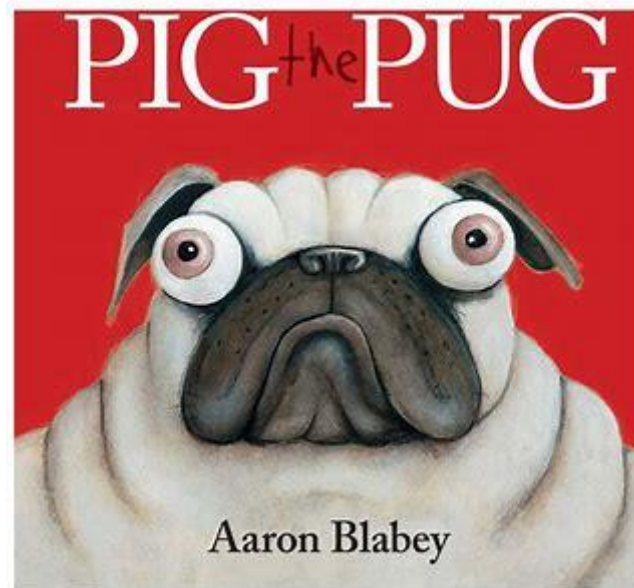


Pig the Pug

<p>08.06.20 Day 1</p>	<p>How many of these words do you know? Can you find the meanings of new words?</p> <p>greedy selfish grumble swine satisfied alike pretend bored</p>
<p>09.06.20 Day 2</p>	<p>Have a look at the picture below. Which words describe Pig and which describe Trevor? Then, write some sentences to compare Pig with Trevor using the conjunction 'but'. You can have a look at the picture to help you. <p>10.06.20 Day 3</p>	<p>Why don't you try making a leaflet about your chosen pet? Will it be about a cat, parrot, or rabbit or even a completely different pet? You can gather information about the specific pet and then use questions as headings. Don't forget to draw the pet.</p>

	<p>Try using the internet or non-fiction books to help you.</p> <p>Now use these ideas to write a leaflet about the pet you have chosen. Try using questions as headings: <i>What do cats eat?</i> <i>Where do cats sleep?</i> <i>What do cats play with?</i></p>
<p>11.06.20 Day 4</p>	<p>Discuss with someone at home the following questions:</p> <p>What does it mean to be kind? Why might someone behave in an unkind way? Do you really think Pig changed his ways? What do you think of the idea that dogs choose their owner? Do you have any pets or know anyone who does? What is/are the pet(s)? How do they compare with the dogs in the story?</p>
<p>12.06.20 Day 5</p>	<p>Now here's a BIG challenge!</p> <p>Can you re-tell the whole story from beginning to end? Maybe you could find somebody at home to act it out with you. Who will be Pug? Who will be the Trevor? Don't forget to send in some pictures on Google Classroom.</p>
